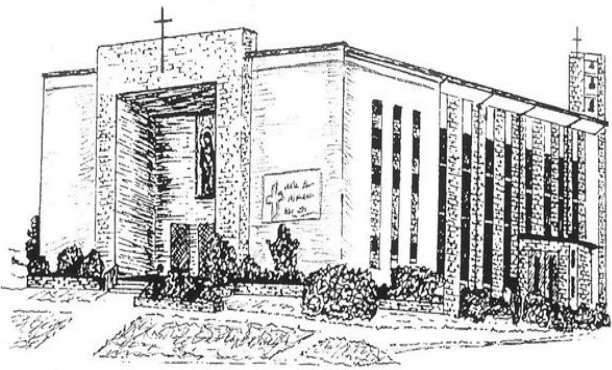

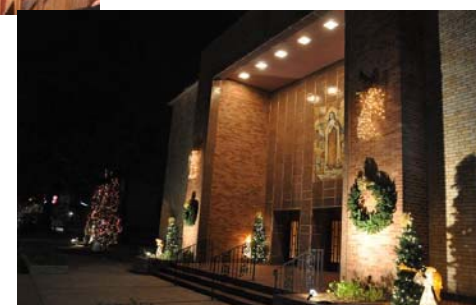

From Our Music Ministry

Happy New Year to everyone! I hope that this year brings you many blessings from God. I want to thank all of the choirs who helped to make our Christmas celebrations even more special. Thank you for your hard work, your time, and your musical talents.

How are we doing with the changes in the Mass? I hope by now that we are getting more accustomed to the new translation. I still haven't memorized the creed but most of the other responses are becoming more natural. I hear the congregation singing the new Mass parts (Holy, Mystery of Faith, Amen, and Lamb of God) so I assume that the transition wasn't that difficult. We'll continue with this set of Mass parts until Lent or Easter.

Janet and I had a wonderful opportunity in November to take a small group of teens and adults from the Archdiocese to the National Catholic Youth Conference (NCYC) in Indianapolis. NCYC is held every other year and I believe it is the largest Catholic conference in the country. There were over 23,000 Catholic teens and adults gathered in Indianapolis this year. The conference consists of keynote speeches, hundreds of breakout sessions, prayer, and music. There is also an exhibition area where various organizations pertaining to youth ministry can showcase their offerings. In addition to the exhibitors, the hall also has areas for games and service projects as well as booths for 50 or so religious orders where the teens can talk to the priests, brothers, and sisters about their vocations.

The best part of the conference in my opinion is the closing Mass. Rarely can you celebrate Mass with 23,000 other Catholics in one place. The opening procession lasted 15 minutes, as there were 175 seminarians, 250 priests, 30 deacons, and 8 Bishops in attendance. It was wonderful to see all of these ordained and soon-to-be ordained men participating in

the Mass. I can't describe the feeling of hearing everyone in the stadium reciting the people's responses, the creed, and the Lord's Prayer together as one body. It gives you goose bumps.

NCYC is an excellent opportunity for the teens of our Archdiocese to see the universality of the Catholic Church. The teens bonded with other teens within the Archdiocese, met teens from other dioceses within our region, and celebrated Mass with teens from all over the country. For a lot of our youth, the only other Catholics they know are from their parish or their school. This conference allows them to see that we are not alone on our little corner of southern Alabama – they share the same faith as thousands and thousands of other teens from around the country. I believe that our teens came away from the conference with a new sense of what it means to be one body in Christ.

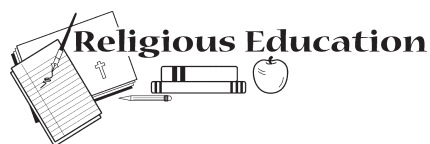

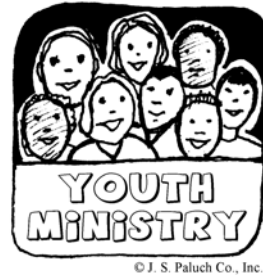

From Pope John Paul II Letter to Priests, Holy Thursday, 2004:

We were born from the Eucharist. If we can truly say that the whole Church lives from the Eucharist ("Ecclesia de Eucharistia vivit"), as I reaffirmed in my recent Encyclical, we can say the same thing about the ministerial priesthood: it is born, lives, works and bears fruit "de Eucharistia" (cf. Council of Trent, Sess. XXII, canon 2: DS 1752). "There can be no Eucharist without the priesthood, just as there can be no priesthood without the Eucharist."

We are working diligently on our Strategic Plan, to strengthen our school. I want to share a few of the things we are working on. It is very important to us that you have an opportunity to give input. All of the documents are in draft state until we get feedback. Please drop us a note or send an email with suggestions. 1. Our draft mission statement

The mission of Little Flower Catholic School is to provide a quality Catholic education for all the children from the diverse economic and cultural backgrounds of the families in our community. We respect and encourage each individual learner to reach his or her maximum potential spiritually, developing a strong faith and relationship with God; academically, continuing to be a life-long learner; physically, having healthy living habits; and emotionally, becoming a self-disciplined, well-rounded member of our "Loop" community who tries every day to "do little things with great love" as did our patron, Saint Therese of the Child Jesus.

2. Planning Assumptions

A. ECONOMIC

1. The economy of the Mobile metro area will not improve significantly and will follow the natural progression of the national recession.
2. The cost of educating students will continue to rise faster than the economic growth of the area.

B. DEMOGRAPHIC

1. There are small pockets of revitalization in the surrounding "Loop" area.
2. Little Flower School and Church draw from the entire Mobile metro area. There is a marked increase in the parish population which in turn should increase the school population.
3. The diversity of our student body and their economic status continues to broaden.

C. FINANCIAL

1. The annual fund will continue to increase as we expand our contributor base and marketing. Signature fundraisers will continue to be one of the primary sources of additional income.
2. The number of families who seek financial assistance will continue to grow for several years, as well as the amount of assistance they request (based on recession).
3. The operating cost will continue to rise beyond the revenue generated by planned minimal increases in tuition.
4. Capital improvements will continue to be necessary due to the advanced age of the facility with limited provision in the budget.

D. GENERAL

1. Parents will continue to seek a Catholic education, particularly in grades 6-8 based on the perception of middle schools in the Mobile area.
2. The future of the school is reliant upon a sound strategic and marketing plan for stability and growth.
3. Archdiocesan wide equalization of services, tuition, fees, and salaries, needs to be initiated to promote growth and excellence in all Catholic schools. *next page*
